

### HISTORY OF 196th BDE

Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 196th Infantry was constituted in Buffalo, New York. On June 24, 1921. It was in the Organized Reserves as an organic element of the 98th Infantry Division.

The unit was ordered to active service on June 9, 1942. During World War II, the unit saw service in the Pacific Theater and occupation duty in Japan. It was inactivated at Osaka, Japan, on February 16, 1946.

Returning to a reserve status in 1947, the unit remained as part of the 98th Infantry Division (USAR) in New York state. On May 1, 1959, the unit was redesignated as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 196th Infantry Brigade and allotted to the Regular Army.

On September 15, 1956, the unit was reactivated as the 196th Light Infantry Brigade at Fort Devens, Massachusetts. Included in this reactivation were the 2nd Battalion, 1st Infantry; 4th Battalion, 31st Infantry; 3rd Battalion, 21st Infantry; and F Troop, 17th Cavalry. It was not until four years later, on July 1, 1969, that the 1st Battalion, 46th Infantry became a part of the 196th Infantry Brigade.

The basic mission of the brigade at the time of its activation was to train the 2,000 recruits who would make up the unit, and to reach a combat-ready posture by May, 1966.

In April, 1967, the "Chargers" became part of the first U.S. Army troops in I Corps when they arrived in Chu Lai to join the newly formed Task Force Oregon which later became known as the 23rd Infantry Division (Americal). The brigade has operated throughout the First Military Region and is country located at Da-Nang.



# Chargers regain independent status

DA NANG - The 196th Infantry Brigade

DA NANG - The 196th Infantry Brigade (Chargers) once again receives and accomplishes its mission as a separate brigade, as it did before joining the 23d Infantry Division in 1967.

Under the command of Brigadier General Joseph C. McDonough, the Charger Brigade now reports directly to HQ XXIV Corps at Da Nang.

The brigade is primarily tasked with the defense of U.S. installations in the Da Nang area.

To accomplish this mission, both support and combat units of the organization have been beefed-up. In mid-October a composite support battalion was formed to centralize and streamline administrative, logistical, training and maintenance

battalion was formed to centralize and streamline administrative, logistical, training and maintenance services for the brigade combat units.

The brigade combat units—three grunt battalions, an artillery battalion and two cavalry units—keep the enemy on the move so that he doesn't have time to launch an attack against the U.S. installations or activities in the Da Nang area. This mission is accomplished jointly with ARVN units by interdicting enemy support routes and searching out his hiding places in such areas as Charlie Ridge, Arizona Territory and Elephant Valley.

Another part of the Charger mission is to assist units of the Army of the Republic of Vietnam and the Regional and Popular Forces in their continued assumption of the combat role in this

Personnel of the Charger Combat Center regularly provide training for Vietnamese forces both in Da Nang and in Hoi An, about 20 kilometers southwest of Da Nang.

The mission of the Chargers also includes the building of roads to aid the Government of Vietnam with the economic growth of the pacified

The 196th Infantry Brigade first saw active service in the Pacific during World War II. The brigade was deactivated in Japan in 1947 after occupying that country at the completion of the

war.

Reactivated in 1965, the Chargers arrived in Vietnam after a year of training at Ft. Devens, Mass., and the Dominican Republic. Upon its arrival, the brigade was attached to the 25th Division and stationed outside of Tay Ninh, 65 miles northwest of Saigon. miles northwest of Saigon.

## Drug program offers exemption-once

DA NANG-Get off drugs or
be prepared to accept the
consequences!
That statement is the gist of a
new anti-drug offensive
announced for the 196th
In fantry Brigade by its
commanding general, Brigadier
General Joesph C. McDonough.
In a letter addressed to the
officers and men of the 196th,
BG McDonough noted that the

urinalysis test has been expanded from a pre-DEROS test only, to pre-R&R, pre-leave

test only, to pre-R&R, pre-leave and unannounced unit testing.

Test expansion became possible when a new testing laboratory was opened in the brigade area on Oct, 15. The new lab has the capability of testing 2500 men each day.

Thus, our program has been expanded and we are testing units on an unannounced

schedule.... This new program provides the means of identifying drug users now," BG McDonough continued. Periodic unannounced

urinalysis testing is the backbone
of the drug treatment program.
Any person who has a drug
use problem has a choice. He can sweat out the urinalysis test and take his chancs on being identified as a drug user, or he can ask for exemption from his

commanding officer.

Exemption is defined as immunity from punishment and notoriety for any individual who voluntarily requests help with a drug use problem.

Criteria for being granted exemption are tough.

First, the request for exemption must be completely voluntary and must be approved by a man's commanding officer. Also, the men must not have

been previously identified as a drug user through unit urinalysis testing or prior drug-related offenses. Finally, he must have 45 days remaining in-country.

When an individual is granted exemption, he will be voluntarily admitted to the U.S. Army Rehabilitation Center at Camp Viking, Da Nang.

The mission of the rehabilitation center is to help continued on page 2

# **Bn CO compliments** unit on job well done

LZ LINDA-Lieutenant Colonel Clyde J. Tate, commanding officer of the 1st Bn., 46th Inf., is scheduled to DEROS from his second Vietnam tour this month. A career-long infantryman-(24 years), he is quite outspoken, both about the infantry in general and the battalion which he has commanded over the past 12 months.

The following are his comments in answer to questions posed by the Charger.

The interview was conducted at LZ Linda.

QUESTION: Why do you command an infantry battalion in particular?
"I guess it's more a matter of responsibility than

anything. The greatest honor to a career officer is to give him a command. He starts with a squad or platoon and then builds up over the years to command a battalion.

I've commanded infantry because that's what it's all gearded toward-in the Army the grunt is the ultimate weapon. Of course, as a commander

you have to take all the responsibility—the good and the bad times and every unit has both."

QUESTION: How has the 1st Bn., 46th Inf. compared with your idea of what an infantry battalion should be?

I'd like to see the

I'd like to say that commanding the 1st Bn., 46th Inf. has been a double honor—I've felt honored to have such a fine group of men and they've brought honor upon themselves. I give the credit to every man in the battalion because it was them who made it go. There isn't a CO alive who can accomplish anything without cooperation from the troops. In fact, I like to refer to myself as a member of the team which has comparied the Let. a member of the team which has comprised the 1st Bn., 46th Inf. rather than the commanding officer.

Bn., 46th Inf. rather than the commanded. "In the last year we've always tried to keep our mission foremost in all of our plans and I believe mission foremost in all of our plans accomplished that mission. We have interdicted the enemy lines of supply in our area of operation, resulting in reduced rocket attacks on the city of Da Nang.

"The men have really earned the right to call themselves the 'Professionals.' To me, the greatest compliment you can pay a man is to say that he's professional; he does his job, whatever it is, in a

professional, ne does his job, whatever it is, in a professional manner. I'd say that the greatest part of the men in this battalion are professionals. "Our officers and NCOs have given us great support too. I've tried to impress on each supervisor what you might think is old-fashioned hard-line leadership, but I think it still works.

"Leadership is very basic. You must establish a standard for the men and let them know what it is and they also must know that you won't accept any less. If every man knows what's expected of him and performs up to that standard because he knows you won't accept less, then the mission will be accomplished. I believe that a mission accomplished is the greatest morale builder going." QUESTION: Then you don't

believe there is more apathy among the troops now than

among the troops now than there was back in, say 1967?

"No, I don't. A lot of people seem to think we're just sort of packing up over here. Well, really we're still out on those firebases and some of the men are still in the field. We're conducting a dynamic defense of Da Nang, dynamic in the sense that we're forward of the city limits and cutting off the enemy before he gets close enough to rocket the city. Today I think the men are doing an outstanding job of making our defense dynamic.

"We wouldn't be doing as well as we are if everybody was apathetic. Every one of my men would go home today if he had the chance, but while he's here he's doing the best he can, "I would compare the soldiers

in this battalion today with any that have ever fought here.

"One program instituted in r battalion is, I think, our battalion is, I think, especially good to keep interest high and apathy low. At regular intervals we send a support soldeir-I don't like the term REMF-out onto a firebase to watch for a couple of days, attend the briefings, and maybe even fly on one of the birds out into the field for a few house. into the field for a few hours. It helps him relate his job in the rear to the overall mission of the

#### Army releases grow

WASHINGTON (ANF)-The Department of the Army has announced the expansion of several early-release programs which are already in effect.

The increased releases will be completed by June 30, 1972,

and apply to Army (US) and first-term Regular Army (RA) enlisted personnel.

The expanded early release program set up for Vietnam returnees will also be effect through June 30, 1972.

US and first-term RA personnel who, upon arrival at a state

side overseas-returnee station between now and June 30, 1972, and have 179 days or less to their normal separation date will be released upon arrival at the port.

In addition, US and first-team RA personnel returning from the Republic of Vietnam who have more than 179 days but less than 12 months until ETS may request voluntary release upon arrival at the port.

upon arrival at the port.

Those eligible under this option must sign a statement that they understand that it takes 18 months or more active-duty time to qualify them for the full 36 months of veterans' educational benefits (less time gets one-and-a-half months credit for each month).
